















Apply for an ETA

An electronic travel authorisation (ETA) gives you permission to travel to the UK.

An ETA lasts for 2 years or until your passport expires, whichever is sooner.

You can travel to the UK as many times as you want in that time.

It costs £10 to apply.

Take a photo of your passport



You need to take a photo of the passport you will use to travel to the UK. Your ETA will be linked to this passport.

The photo must show:

- all 4 corners of the details page
- the machine-readable zone (MRZ)
- the photo of you

This is so we can check the information stored in your passport.

Close your passport and remove any cases you have on the phone or your passport before you continue.
